Important- Presentation Day and Year 6 Farewell Update

We wish to advise that **our annual presentation day WILL go ahead in our top COLA**, but will operate quite a bit differently to than in past; as described below:

Term 4, Week 6

- There will be TWO separate presentation ceremonies, one for students in K-2 (KG, K/1D and 1/2D) and one for students in 3-6 (3/4H and 5/6TM)
- The K-2 Presentation Assembly will begin at 9.30am and finish at 10.10am, whilst the 3-6 assembly will begin at 10.30am and finish at 11am. Guests attending the 3-6 ceremony should not expect entry to the school prior to the start time, as we will need to sanitise/ change over furniture. Students are permitted to leave with their carer at the conclusion of the presentation
- There will be an attendance limit of **one** family member per student, in order to fulfil our obligations to ensure social distancing for adults occurs. Although we would love to see all of you attend, unfortunately, this is all we have space for. Students are not required to socially distance.
- Guests of students attending will be required to RSVP to guarantee their attendance. If we are not expecting you, unfortunately you will not be permitted to attend
- Guests will be required to sign in and out, on arrival and departure, and must also complete a COVID declaration

As far as the Year 6 Farewell goes, we have been able to, at this stage, secure the Dora Creek Workers auditorium as a venue, under strict COVID guidelines. In the past, Year 5 students have been invited to attend the Year 6 Disco after the formalities, though this year, this will not be occurring. For 2020, only Year 6 students, two family members and supervising staff will be permitted to attend this event. Thank you for your understanding in trying circumstances.



Crazy Hair Mufti


